



Senator's son releases Katrina benefit album

PASCAGOULA, Miss. The son of Mississippi Senator Trent Lott has written the title track to a newly released C-D that benefits recovery from Hurricane Katrina.

Pascagoula native and political lobbyist, Chet Lott, wrote the title track for the C-D, "Erased It."

Lott says he wrote the song after seeing the devastation after he arrived in Pascagoula following the Hurricane's onslaught.

That song prompted an album to benefit the survivors of the storm.

The executive director of the Southeast Mississippi Chapter of the American Red Cross, Paige Roberts, says all the proceeds from the album sales will go directly into the community to disaster preparedness and countless other areas.

The 14-track album features guest musicians Cheryl McKenney, Kati Penn, Eddie Prichard, John Richardson, Frank Saxton, Gordon Towell, Greg Wing and Jay Flippin.

To date, more than 500 copies of the C-D have been pre-ordered.

Lott says he plans to issue a check to the American Red Cross chapter quarterly.
